Treasurer – Responsible for all monies paid or received to the Club. Provide financial statement during Club meetings.


Events Director – Responsible for the organization and time management at every race.

GAINESVILLE RACEWAY

Traveling South on I-75, take exit #399 and turn left onto US 441 S. Go approx. 12 miles and turn left on CR 121. In approx. 3 miles turn right onto CR 231. In approx. 3 miles turn right onto 156th Ave (CR 340). In 3.8 miles take right fork onto CR 225, travel approx. 2.7 miles to racetrack.

Traveling North on I-75, take exit #382, Williston Road (CR 331), turn left (East) to Waldo Road (SR 24)and go North. Turn left on NE 53rd Ave. and make the immediate right on to CR 225, go 3 -1/2 miles to track.

Or, take exit #390, 39th Ave (CR 222) turn right heading East, to Waldo Rd. (SR 24), turn left. Turn left on NE 53rd Ave. and make the immediate right on to CR 225, go 3-1/2 miles to track.

SEPTEMBER RACE REPORT

The large turnout resulted in a large number of single-car classes as we had 7 this month. Anthony Ford brought out his baby, an '09 Nissan GTR in AS, Kevin Spence took no BS in his M3, Erich Mertz had no substitute in CS, Ludwig Bavetta was a oneman show in FS, Blake Argenziano rode his little pony in GTS, Richard Fickes was prepared for BP and Seiji Schoppert was EP. The rule for the 2-driver classes was you either had to drive a kart, or a Mazda. Mickey Gauldin took SMRT, Chuck Peterson was fast & shifty in the Shifter Kart class and Thomas Foschini hammered out a win in the Non-shifter Kart class.

The Novice class had more drivers than all of the single-car and 2-driver classes combined. It also did a good job of representing various manufacturers. What it did not do a good job of was creating close competition as class winner Michael Sydnor was almost 2 seconds faster than 2nd place finisher Brice Douai, who was over 0.8 seconds faster than 3rd place T.J.
