JANUARY RACE REPORT

Ah, a brand new year, a brand new racing season and a brand new set of rules for car classification. Back in the mid 1980's (ancient history, I know) there was a TV show called "Growing Pains". I think that would be apropos for the start of 2009. Our club is larger now in this, its 50th year, than at any time in its illustrious past. More cars, and greater diversity among cars, made classing increasingly difficult and the membership voted (by a 3-to-1 margin) to adopt a variation of SCCA classing. This slowed things down at registration and tech. Add to this a major meltdown of our new wireless timing system and the New Year did not start off as smoothly as hoped. But, just like in that classic episode of "Growing Pains", where Gilligan and the Skipper autocross a couple of coconut cars, our hearty group of gear heads managed to have a great, great day of racin', even if the announcement of the catchphrase lacked authenticity.

In typical Florida fashion, the January event boasted temperatures in the mid 70's, plenty of sunshine and 94 drivers. It also boasted 7 drivers with no competition. Given that I was one of those single-car classes, it can only be concluded that us single-car people scared away the competition. Right? Anyway, this month's fear-inducing drivers were James Brunsman in FSP, Gigantor in XP, Stu Chaplan in EP, Jeff Binford in SM, Chuck Peterson in Shifter Kart, Thomas Foschini in FJA and Ryan Collyer in FJB. We had a handful of 2-car classes, where Wendy Mertz again beat her dad Erich in SS, Rob Post posted the win over Ludwig Bavetta in ES, Marc Dana squeezed out a 12-second win over Alex Cohen in FP, John Impens edged Jeremy Allers by just 0.178 in STS and John Genduso showed bad manners by beating his host, George Murray, by over a full second in STX.

AS, which used to be a deserted wasteland, was pleasantly populated with 7 drivers, including the return of Terry Keller. However, in true "Growing Pains" fashion, this turned into a family squabble between husband and wife, with Terry Tabor showing no mercy (and no common sense) by beating his lovely wife Patsy by over a full second, with Steve Gray 3rd. DS could have meant "Dude, Seriously?" this month as Bruce Abbott was in a vehicle from this century. Not only that, but the 80-year young hotshot took the class win by 2.3 seconds over Richard Thackway. GS pitted Mini vs. VW, with Raddy Schatte clubbing his way to the win over Christian Christoefl. Rounding-out the stock classes, HS was nice and consistent, as each driver finished about one second behind the guy in front of him, with Ben Turner taking the victory and Craig Miller finishing 2nd.

An asp is a venomous snake, while the ASP class was filled with venomous Corvette drivers and the Giddens'. Don Hosler snaked his way to a fast first run and held on to win over John Giddens, who placed 2nd, and 3rd place finisher Joe Stoddard. Once again. Ryan Speaks let a fast driver co-drive his STi - is he overly generous, stupid. both? Last month he was able to beat his co-driver, but this month is a new year. New Year, same old result as Ryan whipped Matt Ferratusco by 0.059 seconds to take the BSP win and the fastest fendered time of the day. CSP appears to be one of "The" classes this year as 11 drivers showed up to put pressure on club president and defending Tiger Champion Chris Wells. After the 1st round Chris found himself sitting 2nd behind Karel Schneider, with Jason Stroud 3rd. However, Chris found his groove and put down a blistering 49.037 to edge Karel by just 0.061 seconds, with Patrick Wilson 3rd, Scott Swartz 4th and Jason Stroud 5th. DSP had only 3 drivers and Justin Cady took the win over Terry Glazar. ESP is the ability to predict the future. I predict that the ESP class is going to be fun to watch all year as the F-Body and Pony cars duke it out. This month Bill Adams emerged as the winner in a Mustang, with Mike Jones 2nd in a Firehawk and Randall Huls 3rd in a Camaro.

JANUARY RACE REPORT

One person who really likes the new rules in Robert Belvoir, as he now has some competition. Brand new rules, same old result as Bobby Sox won the class with a 50.190, with Penny Belvoir 2nd and Pedro Castillo 3rd. SM2 had some nice diversity, with a Camaro, an RX7, an S2000 and a heavily-modified Corvette. Diversity does not equate to parity as Jim Mueller, in his Z28 Camaro, took the win by over 2 seconds ahead of Leland Giddens in the RX7. Leland was over 2.5 seconds faster than Tyler Muench. With an overabundance of power, but a severe lack of traction and of right foot control, Mark Goodall slipped and slid his way to a 4th place finish. It was not pretty, but it sure looked fun. It reminded me of that episode of "Growing Pains" when Mr. Rourke smiled as Matt Ferratusco yelled "the plane, the plane!"

SMST is the lone exception to the SCCA classing that was adopted - the singular holdover from the most recent version of MSCC classing. I say "most recent" because MSCC classing used to mirror SCCA classing, including the allowance of Rcompound tires in the Stock classes. But, I digress. As expected, SMST was one of the most heavily populated classes, with 11 drivers. And talk about diversity, this class had everything from a 1970's icon Chevy 'Cosworth' Vega, to a '97 BMW M3, to AWD Evo's and STi's, to an '09 GTR. It even pitted evil twin drivers against each other as Dave Weaver finished in both 3rd and 7th place. Even my ESP didn't predict that! Meanwhile, back at the ranch, this year started off like last year ended, with the SMST battle boiling down to a 2-driver shootout between Hien Nguyen and Harry Corbin. Hien and Harry have several things in common. They both drive high-powered. AWD vehicles: they both are very fast drivers; they both are super-nice guys; they both have dark hair (which is a scientifically-proven sign of extreme awesomeness); and they both routinely kick the crap out of the rest of the class, in the nicest possible way. Something else they had in common this month was cone trouble, as neither was able to lay down a clean run by the end of the 2nd round. With these cone penalties Hien and Harry (sounds like a bad 80's Pop group or a fad clothing shop) found themselves sitting in 6th and 9th place, respectively. Yeowzers! 

As usual, the Novice class featured great car diversity, from a brand new Corvette, to some pretty old Miatas (Miati?), with a Lexus, a Focus, a Mini and several Mustangs thrown in for good measure. This was not the easiest course to follow, as evidenced by the 11 "off course" runs registered in the Novice class. Heck, we even had 34 off course runs in the open classes – so Novices, do not get discouraged – it gets easier! Taking 3rd in Novice this month was Oliver Yao, with Ryan Acosta taking 4th and Salim Sanchez finishing 5th.

So, there it is, the start of the new year, which saw a shifter kart unofficially record the fastest time; a bunch of new, old classes; one rather familiar old, new class and the familiar fun in the sun that we've come to know and love. It didn't seem the same without such heavy hitters as Mikael Edstrom and George Bonafede, but the year is young and these guys will make more than a cameo appearance. Just like that favorite "Growing Pains" episode where JR got shot, this year will be a cliffhanger worth watching. So, tune in next month – same Bat time, same Bat channel.

A WORD FROM EL PRESIDENTE

And Now a Word or Two From Our President...

Now that the 2008 race season has come and gone, I would like to personally congratulate all the class champions and recipients of special awards (President's, Ben Yu Team Work, First Lady, etc.). Many thanks also go to my associates on the Executive Board which had some challenging obstacles to overcome this year but did so with all their heart. Even more thanks go to the volunteers who help at every event. But the biggest thanks go to you, the club members, who make this club so successful and enjoyable to be a part of. Is this a great club or what!

This past season had a record number of Active Members, 32 to be exact, and we rewarded those Active Members with a special MSCC logo polo-style shirt. To be considered an Active Member the club has a points system in place that is separate from competition points (Tiger points). To earn Active Member status you must accrue 21 points during that year's race season. The breakdown to earn points is as follows:

1 point = Attending MSCC club meeting

1 point = Competing at MSCC race

3 points = Host an event (Required by all members)

1 point = Executive Board member

1 point = Volunteer positions

So, as you can see, it's not too tough to earn 21 points . . . 9 events + 9 meetings + host 1 event = 21. That gives you 2 events and 2 meetings that you can miss (December is a pointless event). There are also special events that take place throughout the year, like trailer cleaning, which can earn you additional points. This point system also comes into play when its time to renew your membership. You must earn a minimum of 10 Active Member points to be eligible for renewal. This year we relaxed the requirement because we think a lot of members did not realize it, but, come 2010 - be ready for it.

Now onto the 2009 season . . .

First, I need to welcome back Patrick Wilson to the Executive Board as the Events Director. He's replacing Bert Foschini, who is taking over as Pit Patter Editor. Jim Mueller has done a great job as editor, but is moving onto bigger and better adventures. I wish him all the best.

The club had a big change at the end of last season as far as car classing is concerned. In a 3 to 1 vote by our club members a decision to adopt the SCCA car classing and rules associated with car classing was passed. That's a big change for us, but will become easier for the rules committee at the end of this season. Since we are an independent club we are able to vote on rules changes at the end of every season.

I'm looking forward to another great season and hanging out with some of the best people I've ever met. I'm sticking to a goal that I started last year and that is to encourage the "fun" part of this sport. Sometimes we get too wrapped up in the competition aspect of this sport and forget why we started doing this in the first place. TIGER POINTS EXPLAINED

The table above shows how Tiger points are awarded. For example, if there are 5 cars in your class and you finish 3rd, you will acquire 29 Tiger points. The winner of the 5-car class will acquire 40 Tiger points. Points are earned for the 11 events from January through November. Your 2 lowest point totals are then dropped to figure your final Tiger Standings. Overall class awards and individual class awards use the same points system.

This is not to be confused with Active Member points, which are discussed on the opposite page.

5.2 - Year End Awards and Tiebreaker Rules

- **5.2.1** The Tiger Standing is based upon the numeric total of competition points acquired in official events for the competition year with the two lowest events dropped.
- **5.2.2** The Tiger of the Year Award is given to the competitor who scores the most points after drops overall. Additionally, there are awards for each overall class, such as Stock, Street Prepared and Prepared, and awards for individual classes, such as A Stock, B Stock, etc. Special Awards go to the Rookie of the Year, First Lady and the President's Award.
- **5.2.3** Ties for a year-end Championship Award in any category will be broken and a champion determined as follows:
- **5.2.3.1** Competitor with the most 1st place finishes.
- **5.2.3.2** If still tied, Competitor with the most 2nd place finishes.
- **5.2.3.3** If still tied, Competitor with the most overall points.

RULES DISCUSSION

The following rules will be discussed at the February General Meeting:

- 1) MSCC does not provide for separate ladies classes. All ladies are required to run in the class appropriate to their vehicle.
- 2) MSCC will follow the Kart guidelines as set forth by the Central Florida Region of the SCCA, with case-by-case exceptions allowable by the Chief Tech Inspector, Events Director, or Executive Board.
