APRIL RACE REPORT

The inaugural running of the Spring Mini-Prix at Central Florida Road Course was an exercise in patience and adaptation. The name "CFRC" is misleading. While it is certainly in Central Florida, it is the "road course" part that is debatable. To call this a road course is akin to calling Matt Ferratusco a world famous driver who is a mountain of a man with a thick mane of flowing hair. In other words, it has potential, but also has quite a ways to go. Just like steroids, Rogaine and luck could let Matt match the description above, more asphalt – with much better quality – less light poles, less tire walls, less concrete barriers and better access could allow CFRC to become a true road course. It's just not there yet. In DSP Justin Cady took the win over John David, while in ESP Bill Adams won the Mustang battle over Sean Day. But, as usual, all of the action was camped in CSP. Elliott Harvey joined the fray and simply dominated in a Datsun (that's what Nissan's used to be called, kids), taking the class win by over 2 seconds and finishing with the 3rd fastest time of the day. That left the rest of the usual suspects chasing 2nd place. Patrick Wilson was coming off of 2 straight class wins, but could only muster a 5th place finish, more than 1.5 seconds behind 4th place finisher Chris Wells. Chris is the defending class and Tiger

champion, but 2009 has been rough as Chris started the year with a win, then finished 2nd and then 3rd before this month's 4th place finish. At this rate he'll finish 11th in November. Travis Schneider, meanwhile, started the year with cone trouble that landed him an 8th place finish, followed by a 4th place finish and a 2nd place finish. This month Travis won the "except for Elliott Harvey" contest and finished 2nd, over a half second better than his old man, Karel Schneider, who finished 2nd, 3rd and 4th in the first 3 races this year. It's pretty clear that these guys are going to be beating up on each other all year long. Sounds like fun – to watch.

In CP Jeff McElyea returned just in time to take the class win by over 1.5 seconds ahead of 2nd place finisher Jim Mueller. Joe Stoddard returned from a tough house-sitting gig in Las Vegas (the poor lad) and finished 3rd, less than 0.4 seconds back. Meanwhile, the King of Bling (aka Robert Belvoir) was happy enough to sing when he saw he would be competing in a 6-car class. That would explain why he was jumping around giggling, "I'm rich, I'm rich!" While Robert may not be a thousandaire, he certainly scored a healthy amount of points by taking the class win by a margin of over 3.5 seconds. Louis Murphy finished 2nd, Pedro Castillo was 3rd and Penny Belvoir finished 4th. In ST it was the Toyota Corolla of Jeremy Allers that overpowered the Acura Integra of John Impens (you don't hear that every day), with the Toyota Yaris (see, you can race anything!) of Billy Ono 3rd. In STX nationally known driver Bryce Merideth piloted his sweet-sounding Beemer to an easy 3.6 second victory over Terry Glazar, while William Kuykendall finished 3rd.

If you will recall, last month I commented that George Bonafede's yellow Evo, the Atomic Banana II, was in danger of being dubbed the Atomic Lemon. Apparently my crystal balls were right on target as George experienced some car trouble and ended up co-driving Bill Collyer's Evo. Different car, same result as George won the SM class by a cartoonish 10.5 seconds (did I mention this was a wacky event?) over Randall Huls, with Rashaun Bush 3rd in a rather graphic Dodge Caliber. Meanwhile, in SSM, Mikael Edstrom allowed Matt Ferratusco to co-drive his car, which used to mean an automatic loss for the kind host. Lately, however, that has not been the case as Matt has been spending more time on his career as a stunt driver and child star stand-in than as a lowly autocrosser. Still, baldness notwithstanding, the shrimp can drive, but then again, so can Mikael. They both had cone trouble and both had very fast raw time runs, but in the end Mikael was the victor, after which he performed his traditional Swedish victory dance, which looks a lot like a guy with 5 kids trying to round them all up before losing his mind. Matt took 2nd and Julie Edstrom (she is the brains and beauty of the Edstrom family) took 3rd.

In keeping with recent tradition, the largest class of the day was SMST, the lone holdover from MSCC's previous car classification rules. So far this year, this class has been the playground of Hien Nguyen, giving him the early Tiger points lead. But at the Mini Prix, where the speeds are higher and drivers who usually do not run with us join in, things can change. Yeah, right. Hien led from his first run and never looked back, turning an extremely impressive time of 65.370, on street tires, taking the class win by over 1.3 seconds, as well as another boat load of points. Anthony Ford, in his beautiful GTR, managed a 2nd place finish and Harry Corbin took 3rd. Steve Pierce managed a 4th place finish and Mark Goodall slipped and slid his way to the 5th and final trophy spot. And talk about diversity, this class boasted several Evos, a GTR, an STi, an M3, a Corvette (twin turbo, no less), an S2000, a 350Z, a Forester (the car, not the park ranger) and a Mini.

So, with the Spring Mini-Prix behind us, its time to look forward to the heat of summer and the heating up of the various class battles. Will anyone rise up and take control of CSP? Can anyone keep up with Hien Nguyen? Will George be able to race the same car for more than 2 months in a row? Only time will tell, though my crystal balls sometimes give me a little sneak peek. It's wacky I tell ya.

WORK DUTIES-A REMINDER

Work Duties during Competition Runs Trailer Positions:

<u>Computer Data Entry</u> - for <u>trained</u> personnel only. Responsible for inputting a driver's number and class to ensure times are entered correctly. Responsible for inputting any cone penalty or off course calls radioed from a station worker, as well as acknowledging receipt of the call from the station worker. If there is a problem with the computer or timing software, this person is responsible for notifying the starter to hold the start until the problem is corrected.

Manual Times Entry - Responsible for accurately writing down the car number, the car class, run time, and any cone or off course penalties. This position is vitally important as it is the backup in case of computer issues. If there is a problem with keeping track of the manual times, this person is responsible for notifying the starter to hold the start until the problem is corrected.

Announcer - Announces driver name and time once the driver has finished his/ her run, in addition to any cone or off course penalties. Serves as an extra set of eyes if a cone is down and can use the PA system to call "Red Flag" if an unsafe condition is observed on course or if the start needs to be held for any reason.

Station Worker: (Minimum of 2 per station)

Responsible for accurately writing down, on the clipboard provided, car number and class, along with any cone penalty or off course call that occurs at the station they are working. In addition, the cone penalty or off course call must be radioed to the timing trailer. If the trailer does not acknowledge the call, it must be repeated. A different station worker must be holding the red flag, unfurled and ready to waive, if a "Red Flag" call is heard, or if a dangerous or potentially dangerous situation is observed on course. The red flag is not to be waived if a cone is down. All station workers must hustle when picking up cones that have been knocked down or pushed out of the box. Look behind the car for cones, and be aware of other vehicles out on course at all times. If a cone is still in the box it is not a penalty, but must be re-set to the center of the chalked box.

Starter

This must be an experienced person. Responsible for radioing to the timing trailer the car number and the car class of the vehicle at the starting line. Responsible for making sure the course is "green" and clear of station workers prior to waiving the green flag to send the vehicle onto the course. Responsible for starting vehicles at the appropriate safe point, which is pre-determined (and adjusted) by the executive board. If a driver does not have his/her seatbelt fastened and helmet on and secured, the starter can not allow the car on course.

Staging

Responsible for sending vehicles to the start line when it is safe to do so. Responsible for making sure that the vehicles in the "Course Worker and Multi-driver" lane are sent at a rate of at least 2 course worker or multi-driver vehicles to every one car in the regular line. Vehicles sent to the start line must be prepared to race, including seat belt fastened and helmet on and secured.

Event Hosts

During competition runs - responsible for filling in any vacant course worker position or any other duties the events director assigns.


