



Don't feel bad Penny, your old man beat everyone this month as he finished with a blistering time of 42.342 to take TTD honors. Not bad for an old guy! Robert's TTD competition was Mikael Edstrom, who beat Salim Sanchez in SSM and was the only other driver to run under 43 seconds. Thomas Foschini won the FJA contest over Stephanie Peterson, and Heather Peterson won the FJB battle over newcomer Cameron Schultz. Headto-head Thomas beat me, but that will be our little secret; don't tell anyone, especially mom.

The Novice class was the mother of all classes, boasting 14 drivers. Those 14 drivers accounted for 22 off course runs, including a total of 0 clean runs for the bottom 3 finishers. Everyone knows that a Ferrari is fast, but everyone who autocrosses knows that clean and slow beats fast and off course every single time – just ask your mother. Anyway, taking the 5th and final trophy spot was E Gareth Morgan in an Eclipse, with Michael Pagan 4th in a Civic. Up until last month Wendy Mertz had been beating her father like a disobedient wild child, but Erich Mertz regained parental control with another win in SS this month. In AS Bob Blucher loaned his car to Harry Corbin, but he didn't loan him any mercy as Bob won by over 1.4 seconds, with Harry 2nd and Brad Gooch 3rd. In DS it was the BMW battle and, as fate would have it, a mom showed the young guys how it's done as Dawn Giddens toyed with the boys all day before clipping Richard Thackway by just 0.055 seconds on her final run, with Mark Gocken 3rd. In GS the battle was about as tight as it can get. Raddy Schatte held the lead after each of the first 3 runs, but on his final try Christian Christoefl nipped Raddy by just 0.019, with Watter Christoefl only 0.013 behind Raddy. The top 3 were within 0.032 of each





Ben Turner came the closest, but fell just short and finished 2nd, his son Travis Tuner took 3rd and relative newcomer Benjamin Loving finished 4th.


In ASP John Giddens once again found himself battling a den of Z06's, but this month John was the snake charmer as he won the class by 0.889 over Don Hosler, with Rick Woodley 3rd. In CSP Travis Schneider took a lot of the mystery and intrigue away by putting down a hair-raising time of 43.287 on his 1st run, which no one else in the class could touch for the rest of the day. Papa Karel Schneider came within 0.248 to finish 2nd, but Patrick Wilson was over a full second off of the pace in 3rd and Chris Wells found himself with another 4th place finish. There is a rumor floating around that Karel and Travis are going to make that car even faster in the very near future, which could spell a mother load of trouble for the rest of the class. In DSP newlywed Justin Cady was able to hold off Terry Glazar and in ESP oldlywed Chuck Peterson scored an easy 2-second victory over Bill Adams.

I guess MSCC is not immune to the effects of the slumping economy as the SMST class continued to show declining numbers. In both March and April SMST showed a rebound, with 13 drivers, meaning maximum Tiger points. This month that number was cut nearly in half as only 7 drivers showed up. That's still a good number of drivers and even managed to tie for the largest points-paying class of the day, but it pales in comparison to the good old days, meaning last month. However, is it really the economy, global warming, or the prospect of having to face the seemingly unbeatable Hien Nguyen? One person who felt up to the challenge was Ryan Speaks, who decided to put the same type of tires on both ends of his vehicle - just like mom used to. Would Hien crack under the pressure of a heavy hitter like Ryan jumping into his class? At the beginning it sure seemed to as Hien coned on both of his 1st 2 runs, giving the early lead to Ryan by default. Ryan actually had a quicker raw time on his 1st run, but Hien was more worried about the cones that kept jumping in front of him than big old Ryan. In the 3rd round Hien cleaned things up and took a slim lead of just 0.085 as Ryan slowed down by a full second. If Ryan had anything for Hien he would have to step up on his 4th a final run, which is exactly what Ryan did by dropping almost a half a second to finish with a 43.585, which was 0.4 seconds faster than Hien. Now all of the pressure was back on Hien - he had only 1 clean run up to this point and was facing a 0.4 second deficit. How would he respond? Hien may not be the biggest guy around, but he certainly stood tall when it counted as he dropped over ³/₄ of a second to take the win from Ryan with a red-hot time of 43.238, on street tires! Hien's time was good enough to be the 3rd fastest time of the day, beating a slew of very good drivers who were on race tires. Ryan was no slouch either as his time was 7th quickest overall. Fred Zimmerman took 3rd place in his Cooper S, while Steve Pierce finished 4th and Oliver Yao finished 5th.

So, with 5 of 11 events now in the books, we are officially preparing to pass the halfway point of the season. The small fact that it was so hot, and its not even summer yet, is a little worrisome. But this club has managed to survive for 50 years because we don't let small things like hurricanes and heat stroke stand in the way of a good time. Speaking of which, I'm having a good time watching the various class battles. Now that we are entering the heart of the season it's only going to get better. I'm pretty sure mom would agree, and I know she's watching. Moms are like that—isn't it great?









PRESIDENTIAL WORDS OF ADVICE

When walking the course in the morning there are several things you should be analyzing, other than just memorizing the course design. Here are a few things that will provide a more beneficial course walk and should improve your lap times.

- Walk the course as many times as needed to solidify your plan (too many times may lead to 2nd guessing)
- Keep the conversations with your friends to a minimum. Concentrate on the course.
- Walk the course in the same location as if you were in your car (i.e. left side of gates).
- Pay attention to when you will need to up-shift/down-shift.

Pay attention to braking points.

Ask other drivers for advice.

- Participate in the "Novice walk-thru" even if you are an experienced driver.
- Try to visualize the course as if you were floating above it; the "bird's eye view".
- Recite the course out loud (i.e. launch, slight right, big left, short straight into slalom, big left, wiggle, big left, finish). Our courses are usually longer, but you get the idea.
- No need to memorize every cone, only the ones you plan to be near the important ones.

As a final note . . . while sitting in grid run the course through your head or recite it out loud and plan your attack. You can always ask an experienced driver if you can ride with him/her, too.

I have yet to master this great sport and I'm sure there are more suggestions out there. These are just a few things I do at each event and I still learn something new almost every time.

Remember...Race Safe, Race Smart, but always Have Fun.
