February is a magical month. Why do I say that? I'm glad you asked. (You did ask, didn't you, or am I hearing those darn voices again?) It is the only month of the year that can pass without a single full moon. It is the only month of the calendar that, once every six years and twice every 11 years, will have only four full 7 -day weeks. It is the only month of the year that has less than 30 days, and it is the only month of the year that both my son and I were born. In this, the $50^{\text {th }}$ year of MSCC, it was also full of 2's, deuces and doubles, starting with it being the second (that's a 2) event of the year; our driver count was double 7's (77); we ran 2 laps; we made 2 runs back-to-back (which is highly unusual for us) and we only had 2 heats. Fill my eyes with that double vision.

If you're still not buying the 2 , deuces, doubles thing, try this on for size - there were 12 classes that involved 2-driver battles, which is more than double the next most popular class size, which was the single car classes, of which there were 5 . Clear? So, let's get to the deuces wild classes, beginning with, where else, AS. Last year was last year, this year is this year (deep stuff, eh?) but you wouldn't know it from the Mertz clan as Erich and Wendy continued their epic father vs. daughter battle. Erich held a lead of just less than 0.2 seconds after his last run, putting all of the pressure on Wendy. When she crossed the line with a time of 66.688 Erich initially dropped his head in defeat, then quickly recovered to claim the victory was due to his superior coaching. Nice recovery. In BS it was Honda S2000 time as Christian Christoefl and Rose Bartl each piloted the now extinct model, with Christian the victor. DS was no contest, literally, as Roger Everett went off course on all 3 runs, though Raddy Schatte would have won even if Roger's times had counted. In FS it was the Mustang GT of Bill Kuykendall vs. my new baby, a BMW 335 i . I looked like a total dork, with my car covered from stem to stern with blue painters tape, yet I still managed to eek out a win. In HS Craig Miller proved, once again, that the Toyota Cressida is not to be messed with as he beat Joey Maier by almost 3 seconds.

In ASP Don Hosler added more credence to his "Mr. Excitement" moniker with the most thrilling (and, thankfully, only) off course, over the curb, into the grass, toward the fence spin of the day. The excursion actually embedded sand into the bead of both left side tires, causing them to go flat. He was able to get them cleaned out and refilled, but could not get close to John Giddens, who turned a time of 63.910 into a 2.7 second win. In ESP it was Mustang vs. Mustang, with Sean Day and Chris Gould going at it. Chris was able to make it close, but Sean rode away with the W. XP had something you don't see everyday vs. something you don't see everyday. Kim DeBower was driving his very cool looking, and even cooler sounding, Factory Five Cobra, while Greg Voth was driving a not as cool looking, but equally cool sounding $5.0 \mathrm{~L}-$ powered Volvo wagon. Kim got the win, but Greg got his fair share of appreciative smiles. EP was a true co-driver battle, as Shiva Wilson and Steve Marcum shared a Dodge Neon. Steve held the early lead through the $1^{\text {st }} 2$ rounds, but Shiva got serious on his final run to take a 1.8 second victory. In STX it was the Acura RSX of Meagan Riesen against the BMW 325i of Andre Morales. They swapped the lead after each of the $1^{\text {st }} 2$ rounds, with Meagan emerging as the victor. STU was a BWM battle, as Richard Thackway brought out his newly purchased BMW 335i to take on the BMW M3 of Kevin Spence. Richard picked up an early cone and Kevin picked up a late cone, while in between Richard took the class win. And, finally, we come to SSM, which pitted the Corvette of Mikael Edstrom against the Miata Gay Car of Travis Schneider. Now, we do not condone betting at MSCC, but Mikael and Travis wagered a whole dollar on this event. Mikael did his best to make things interesting - he went off course on his first run (and dragged several cones along for a ride), then picked up 2 cones on his $2^{\text {nd }}$ run, giving Travis a 2.2 second lead with 1 run remaining. Travis simply refused to take advantage by knocking down 2 cones on his final run, while Mikael tamed his right foot to take a 4.6 second win.

There were 5 drivers that had no competition, meaning they were really just racing against themselves, meaning they could just take it easy, right? Tell that to Ben Turner as he wasn't taking anything easy. In fact, he pushed it so hard that he went off course on all 3 runs.

In the immortal words of Mr. Spock, "that's a bummer." In GS Bruce Abbott stubbornly refused to act his age, in BSP Mickey Gauldin stole a class win, in ST John Impens toured to victory, and in Karting action Thomas Foschini slipped and slid to the winners circle, or was that a wagon wheel? As usual, the Novice class had a nice mix of vehicles, including a BMW 335i (what, I get one and suddenly everyone gets one?), a Hyundai Tiburon, a Shelby Mustang GT, a BMW 318ti and a Toyota Corolla. This was no contest as the Tiburon of Seth Maxwell ran away with a 1.2 second win over Michael Krakar's Mustang, with Matt Yates $3^{\text {rd }}$. So, Seth, say goodbye to racing with Novices and hello to open classing.

CS was all Mazdas, all day long. However, the real story here was the saga that is Matt Ferratusco vs. Gerardo Bonilla. For those who don't know, Matt is a very, very good driver. He has been an instructor for Skip Barber Racing School, been a driver in the "Lights, Motors, Action" show at Disney's Hollywood Studios theme park, he was a stunt driver in the "Miami Vice" motion picture, etc. He routinely bums a co-drive from someone, and then returns the favor by trouncing him or her in his or her own car. Everyone, that is, except for a guy we affectionately call "Bobo"; Gerardo Bonilla. Gerardo is Matt's immovable object - try as he might, Matt simply cannot beat Gerardo. The scene usually plays out with Gerardo taking an early lead, then Matt will make a spectacular late run, only to have Bobo beat him in the end. February had no such drama as Matt made his best run on his first run, while Gerardo kept knocking time off with each run and ran away with a dominating 0.7 second win. In the RX-8 battle for $3^{\text {rd }}$ place Josh Coffin bested Patrick Wilson.

Two years ago CSP was the domain of Chris Wells, who not only dominated the class in 2008, but also won the Tiger Championship. Last year was a different story as Travis and Karel Schneider stuffed some big fat tires under their Miata to reign over the class. Would that continue, or would someone new step up? If the $1^{\text {st }}$ round was any indication, it was going to be a wild year, because after the $1^{\text {st }}$ run Leland Giddens was in $1^{\text {st }}$, Kevin King was sitting $2^{\text {nd }}$, Scott Swartz was $3^{\text {rd }}$, Dawn Giddens was $4^{\text {th }}$ and Colm Roe was $5^{\text {th }}$. Chris and Karel had gone off course, opening the door wide open for everyone else. Reality set in after the $2^{\text {nd }}$ round, including the fact that Chris is now sporting some big fat tires too, and it showed as he won with a convincing 62.892, which was not only good enough for a 0.899 second win over Karel Schneider and a 1.6 second win over $3^{\text {rd }}$ place Leland Giddens, but was also good enough for $6^{\text {th }}$ fastest overall. Tom McDonald ended up $4^{\text {th }}$ with Scott Swartz rounding out the top 5 in class. DSP had a growth spurt as Alex and Cara Velez joined the fun, although they basically brought a toy knife to a gun fight. Justin Cady took the class win, with Terry Glazar $2^{\text {nd }}$ and Travis Turner $3^{\text {rd }}$. DP also experienced inflation as Pedro Castillo and Dick Connor joined the fun, but it made no difference as Robert Belvoir again whipped Penny, as well as the rest of the class.

The new class of STR saw Chi Ho post a dominating 4.3 second win over David Pham, with Alexis Flores $3^{\text {rd }}$. SMST2 had diversity, but not much competition as Bob Blucher bobbed his way to a 1.6 second victory over $2^{\text {nd }}$ place Matthew Lowe, with Steve Pierce $3^{\text {rd }}$. In SMST4 Ryan Speaks set the early mark, then held off Hien Nguyen to take the win by 0.3 seconds, with Harry Corbin $3^{\text {rd }}$ and Patrick Barrett $4^{\text {th }}$. Which leaves us with SM. George Bonafede coerced Jason Stroud to be his tire warmer (it took George 0.002 seconds to convince Jason). After a rather steep learning curve, Jason finished $3^{\text {rd }}$ in class and $3^{\text {rd }}$ overall. Jeff Binford retuned and had a very respectable time of 61.264 , but still managed to finish 1.6 seconds behind class winner and TTD driver George Bonafede, whose time of 59.575 made him the only driver to spend less than a minute on course. For now his car will be dubbed "The Silver Bullet", but time will tell if that name will stick.

So, while the February event did not quite go off without a hitch, it certainly was filled with 2's, deuces and doubles. So much so that this special month is also going to have a 2day autocross school, which is more than double the fun of a regular event. The $50^{\text {th }}$ anniversary of MSCC is well under way, with some special events planned throughout the year. The economy may still be wallowing, but MSCC is doubling the fun.

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## Active Member Points

Last month we talked about Tiger Points and how they are awarded. This month we will discuss Active Member points. For all of you Old Dogs out there (and you know who you are!) this is redundant stuff. But for some of the newer people, this will explain how you can earn a coveted, and very exclusive, Active Member shirt. You've seen the shirts that some of the members are sporting, from the latest Red and White Sport-Tek shirts, to some that are so old they are back in style, and you've asked yourself "how can I become that cool?" Well, by earning enough Active Member points. If you are a member and have attended a meeting or event this year, you have earned Active Member points. However, in order to count any points that have been earned so far this year, you must be "paid up". In order to be considered a Member in Good Standing, you have to pay your dues, literally. Membership dues are due by the March General meeting.
