It's hard to believe, but we haven't had an event on Mother's Day since 2009. Given that our races are almost always on the second Sunday of the month, and that Mother's Day always falls on the second Sunday of the month, you would think we would run into this problem more often. Truth be told, it is given consideration when scheduling race dates, which could explain its 3 years absence. Either way, the Mother's Day event 2012 was a mother loving good time. Mother Nature did her part by: 1 - thoughtfully providing shade all day in the form of a thick layer of clouds, which 2 - did not drop any rain on our parade. Thanks Mom! Temperatures were in the mid 80 's with a fairly constant breeze, so we dodged the oppressive heat for one more month, but I predict that the June event will not be so accommodating. Our participation has been down this year but we ended up with 56 drivers at the May event, which was 8 more than last month and just about what we are averaging for the year. In an effort to get home to mom (or hot wife or a cold beer) as early as possible, the event hosts, led by Mickey Gauldin, had the course set up, approved and chalked by 7:45AM. Those hosts were awesome!

There were 27 classes with participants at the May event and 23 of the 27 classes had either 1 or 2 drivers, accounting for a grand total of 30 drivers. The four other classes accounted for 26 drivers. What does this have to do with anything? Not much, but it kind of stands out when you look at the results. So, let's read off the names of all of those lonely folks who ran in a class only a mother could love: Don Hosler in SS, Kim DeBower in DS, Ben Turner in ES, Bruce Abbott in FS (83 years young and still smoking the tires more than any other driver out there!), Steve Marcum in GS, the return of Joe Stoddard (who?) in HS in a cool, old, yellow Austin Healy Sprite, Christian Christoefl in DSP, Randall Huls in ESP, Steve Taylor in CP, Mark Burt in EM, Richard Fickes in FM (stereo?), Matthew Corriveau in STS, Carolyn Smith in STR, Travis Turner in STX, Fred Zimmerman in SMF and Steven Taylor in a kart that made it almost to the starting clocks, then made it almost all the way around before dying. Been there, done that.

The classes with 2 drivers each had their own little story to tell, and some were way more interesting than others. We start with Scott Swartz and Tom McDonald in CS. The story here is that on their third runs, both Scott and Tom ran identical times of 48.996, though Tom clipped a cone. Scott ended up winning the class, but running an identical time is a very rare occurrence, running an identical time in the same class in the same heat is downright extraordinary. In ASP we had everyone's favorite mom, Dawn Giddens and her no-good husband, John Giddens (according to Dawn, John had the audacity to fail to bring her breakfast in bed on the morning of the race! On Mother's Day!) However, that is not the story; the story is the 44.620 that John ran to not only beat his wife by over 3 seconds (on Mother's Day!) but the time was also good enough for TTD, which, if you ask me (which no one did, certainly not Dawn) is quite a sufficient Mother's Day gift. In CSP we had the ongoing battle between Chris Wells and Matt Ferratusco. The story here is how the year has gone so far. On one hand it has been an even match, with each winning twice and with these 2 guys accounting for 3 of the 4 TTD's coming into this event. On the other hand, except for a close 0.038 victory by Matt in February, these guys have been killing each other, with Chris' 2 victories by 2.4 seconds and 1.1 seconds, and Matt's other victory by 1.4 seconds. For an even match the times have not been particularly close, until this month. Matt made his fast run first, which is not how these things usually go, and failed to improve. Chris had a raw time run that was 0.411 (for your information) faster on only his $2^{\text {nd }}$ run, but clipped a cone, leaving him with 3 more tries at it. Chris did eventually knock over a full second off of his first run, but came up just 0.055 short giving Matt a 3-2 lead for the year. In DP we had Robert Belvoir and Eric Olsen. One story here is that Robert did not have poor Penny to beat on this month, but he did have another MR2 to run against as Eric showed up in a ride that was 16 years newer than Robert's. But the most interesting story is that Robert was only 0.133 behind John Giddens for TTD but elected to skip his final 2 runs and the chance at back-to-back TTD honors. In STF we had Mike Brau and Abby Jons. The story here is that this was Abby's first time running with us and she held her own, knocking almost 2 full seconds from her time, but Mike emerged as the winner. In SSM we had Leland Giddens and Rick Woodley. The story here is that this class represented the biggest disparity in power, as Leland was in a Miata and Rick was in a Corvette. However, by all accounts this was a "Miata course". What do you mean, what do I mean? Well, it was designed by a Miata driver and 8 of the 15

Miata's (Miati?) that participated finished in the Top 20, which was more than twice as many as any other manufacturer, let only any other model. So, Rick didn't stand a chance and Leland took the win, proving that handling is more important than sheer horsepower in autocross. And the final 2 car class was the previously abandoned PRO class, where the co-driving tandem of Dat Nguyen and Greg Shumaker battled it out. The story here is that they both made their quickest run on their $2^{\text {nd }}$ run, as well as the fact that Dat was Mr. Clean while Greg took out a total of 8 cones. I have found that hitting cones doesn't hurt as much when you are driving someone else's vehicle, right Greg? Greg won the cone killing portion of the contest, but Dat took the racing victory.

Finally, a class with more than 2 drivers. BS to the rescue, with the astounding total of 3 cars in the class. Interestingly, Mario Knis, Reed LaFerriere and Brian Smith did things the right way, meaning they each made their fastest run on their last run. It took him until his final try, but Mario was able to get under the 50 second mark and took the class win, with Reed $2^{\text {nd }}$. STU was yet another 3 driver class, though the real battle, as it has been all year and for the past few years, was between Kevin Spence and Richard Thackway. These guys are constantly going back and forth, although Richard is up 2-0 so far this year. The May event was yet another close battle. How close? I'm glad I asked. After the $1^{\text {st }}$ run Richard led by 0.8 , but Kevin narrowed that to 0.3 after the $2^{\text {nd }}$ run. Richard extended the lead to 0.7 after the $3^{\text {rd }}$ run, with no improvement for either driver on the $4^{\text {th }}$ run. Richard knocked another 0.2 off his time to take a commanding 1.01 second lead. Kevin then proceeded to knock 1.07 seconds off of his time to come storming back with a win by just 0.06 . Cheerio! (Not the cereal, Kevin and Richard are from the UK, that's how they talk over there. It's weird, I know.) The Novice class had a respectable driver count of 4, making it the $3^{\text {rd }}$ most popular class of the day. It also boasted extreme diversity, from a 1969 Fiat 500 that was not much larger than a St. Bernard, to a Nissan 240SX, to an Audi Quattro to a Porsche 911. Not only that, it boasted the closest competition all day, with the top 3 separated by a mere 0.321 seconds. This was obviously a boastful class and Pat Mooney had the most to brag about as he not only won the class but he was also the only driver in the class to record all clean runs. Zane Plumley finished $2^{\text {nd }}$ by only 0.092 , with Lee Baldwin only 0.049 behind Zane. Congratulations on your Novice victory Pat, it has earned you an express ticket to open classing.

The SMST classes accounted for 16 drivers, with 5 in SMST4 and a whopping 11 in SMST2. A few short years ago SMST was 1 class, with the 2WD and 4WD cars all together. As it stands these 2 classes are traditionally the most heavily attended and the May event held true to form. The SMST4 class was missing 2 heavy hitters, namely Ryan Speaks and Hien Nguyen. I do not know where Ryan was, but Chris mentioned at the Driver's Meeting that Hien was off doing something called Pangea, a type of adventure racing through the wilderness. It is crazy. Anyway, the absence of these guys left the door open for others and Oliver Yao took full advantage and the class win, with Drew Hackett $2^{\text {nd }}$ and Terry Glazar $3^{\text {rd }}$. One interesting note, the top 4 all made their quickest run on their final run and their finishing order was Evo, STI, Evo, STI. And finally, the Mother of all classes, SMST2, with 11 drivers, meaning the maximum amount of Tiger points were at stake. From the outset it was clear that this was going to be a tight battle as the top 4 were within 0.314 of each other after the $1^{\text {st }}$ run, with Mickey Gauldin sitting in $1^{\text {st }}$, Bob Blucher in $2^{\text {nd }}$, Jason Stroud in $3^{\text {rd }}$, Patrick Wilson in $4^{\text {th }}$, Kevin Abel in $5^{\text {th }}$, Steven Hughes in $7^{\text {th }}$ due to a cone penalty and lack-of-mohawk-helmet penalty and Mikael Edstrom in $9^{\text {th }}$ due to unfamiliarity with something called a clutch pedal. After Mikael found that extra pedal he jumped to $1^{\text {st }}$ on his $2^{\text {nd }}$ run, with Steven $2^{\text {nd }}$, Bob $3^{\text {rd }}$, Mickey $4^{\text {th }}$ and Jason $5^{\text {th }}$. This was going to be a war. Steven Hughes put down a 45.826 on his $3^{\text {rd }}$ run, setting the mark for everyone to catch. Patrick came the closest, only 0.115 back, but Steven held on for the win, with Patrick $2^{\text {nd }}$, Mickey $3^{\text {rd }}$ by only 0.3 , Jason $4^{\text {th }}$ by only 0.018 , Bob $5^{\text {th }}$ by only 0.069 and Mikael $6^{\text {th }}$. It should be noted that 4 of the top 6 were driving Miatas (Miati?), with Steven in an S2000 and Bob in a Boxster. Those are some fast Mother Fletchers.

All in all it was the best Mother's Day event we have had in at least the last 3 years, if not more. Our next event will be the Spring Mini-Prix at Sebring, though the thermometer will feel much more like summer. My last piece of advice is to remember to call your mother, even if, like me, it is a very, very, very long distance call across the space/time continuum. I have it on good authority that she will get the call, and she will appreciate it.

Is winning everything????
In a nut shell . . . YES!
BUT what is YOUR definition of winning?
Last month I listed a quote from Bobby Unser:
"Nobody remembers who finished second, but the guy who finished second"
This only applies if your goal is to win the race or get that championship trophy at the end of the year. What if you change your focus a bit to a different variation of "winning" (why do I hear a certain celebrity's voice every time I say that word)? What if you say to yourself "for this run I'm going to concentrate on looking ahead"? So, while sitting at the start line say that out loud right as the green flag drops. You may even want to say it a couple of times during your run to remind yourself. At the end of the run did you accomplish your goal? If you did . . . Awesome!!! On to the next goal.

So you're ready for your next run. This time you remind yourself to "Look ahead" and "for this run I'm going to concentrate on better braking". Remember that braking in racing is different than how you brake when driving on the street. On the street you brake easy and apply more pressure as you come to a stop. In racing, you brake hard at the beginning and ease up as you go through the turn (i.e. trail-braking). This time we're remembering to look ahead and apply better braking throughout the course. You get the idea; now apply a third technique to your next run. If you accomplished your goals, wouldn't that be considered winning? How about creating a "cheat sheet" of simple reminders and apply it to your dash to remind you of your goals.

How about another approach? This year I have told myself to "relax and spend more time with my family while at the races". Much easier said than done - LOL! I have a hard time just sitting as I feel I always need to be doing something. What if my "something" is being there with my family? For each event I have to concentrate hard on spending more and more time relaxing with my family. Talk about a winning situation that pays huge dividends!!!

Here's another example of winning for me. I have the opportunity to get my Time Trials license through NASA at Sebring in June. This is the next level in driving experience for me. I truly love autocrossing and achieved several of my goals in this sport. I have also accomplished becoming a driving instructor with a couple of HPDE driving organizations. Now my goal is to participate in other forms of racing to continue improving my driving abilities. In order for me to get my TT license I have been informed that I will need to compete in two races without spinning my car or putting four wheels off the track in both of those races. I've been around the full course of Sebring plenty of times, so all I really need to do is drive at $8 / 10$ ths and make sure I don't spin or put four wheels off. I don't need to win the class, just accomplish the task at hand. If I do this, then in my mind I won.

So is your definition of winning being able to show off that $\$ 10$ trophy to all your buddies or is it more personal?
